At the elementary school, students all receive an appropriate intervention through special education services, Title I services, or with their classroom teacher. These interventions either bridge the gap between identified needs or provide opportunity for enrichment.

At the middle school high school, an at-risk tutor has been hired to work with students with identified needs to support learning and earn credits toward graduation. They also support teachers throughout the day pushing into classrooms. There is also a certified teacher monitoring grades and scheduling time with students during an Academic Support hour.

Dear Teachers, Parents and Students,

On Monday, September 25, 2023 a presentation of the Yellow Ribbon suicide prevention program will be presented to Central Lake Middle & High School students.

There will be a one-hour presentation beginning at:
Middle School: 9:00 am
High School: 12:45 pm

Suicide is a subject that is difficult to discuss. Providing education can help to prevent suicides and suicide attempts.

The Yellow Ribbon Suicide Prevention Program is an educational initiative with goals of increasing awareness and understanding, creating a dialogue in the community, and making it easier for those who need help to receive it. The presenter has been trained using the Yellow Ribbon Suicide Prevention Program curriculum and will share personal experiences, address myths and facts, teach a vital life skill, and reinforce that suicide does NOT need to be an option. Trainer will emphasize that message that "It's OK to Ask4Help!" We will have local support people there to support our students and staff. This training is presented by Barb Smith Suicide Resource and Response Network and brought to you by Kiersten's Ride.
